Ms. Celeste K. T. Brooks
Director of Therapeutic Activities, SBGC



The Masters Faculty Scholars Program is a consortium of professionals: Social Workers, Doctors, Interns, Nurses and one Activity Director. They (about 20 in total) were all picked from hundreds of candidates. They met for nine months -- once per month for 4 hours on a Monday. It is a class to promote the need for personal-centered care in all aspects of the medical profession. Some of the subjects discussed were: 1)Self Evaluation of Profession; 2) Teaching Methods; 3) Palliative Care and the Activity Professionals Role; 4) Self Creation of Autobiography; 5) Communications About Serious Illnesses; 5) Changing Methods of Training Clinicians and 6) D.C. Office on Aging Programs/Elder Justice. The leader of this course was Ms. Beverly Lundsford, Ph.D., RN, Assistant Professor, G.W. School of Nursing.

Ms. Brooks learned some of the different aspects of other disciplines in different occupations that are related to working with the elderly. She learned that we have a LONG way to go to achieve “person-centered care” in the clinical setting. She also learned that her professional career is not ending, but changing. She may not be an Activity Director for too much longer, but will always be working with the elderly, promoting person-centered care. Each of the Scholars have been invited back to do an in-service for the next group that comes in the next semester. Ms. Brooks is excited about that.

Ms. Brooks appreciates the support and the freedom to achieve from Stoddard Baptist and expressed that she will never forget the wisdom and caring interactions that were shared within this group.
