Mr. Warren Young, a resident already living at The Marigold on 11th Street when Stoddard took over the management, has an interesting story to tell. I sat down and listened to him discuss his childhood and life after childhood and discovered some very interesting things about him. A Veteran of the Army, Mr. Young is very proud of the service he provided. He received his Basic Training in Fort Dix, New Jersey in 1983. Mr. Young's next stop was Aberdeen Proving Ground, a United States Army facility located adjacent to Aberdeen, Maryland where he received his Ordinance Training as a Tank Mechanic. Mr. Young's next assignment was in Fort Hood, Texas where he worked on all types of vehicles, no vehicle was too big or too small. He worked on the very large tanks and was also a Tow Truck Operator. Mr. Young became a Recovery Specialist and his tour of duty now sent him overseas. Landing in Katterbach Army Base in Numenberg, Germany, Mr. Young continued to work on all types of vehicles. While in the military, Mr. Young also became a sharp shooter, a status that was maintained throughout his army career. He states "life was challenging as he strived to meet all expectations in the military, but this is one part of his life that he would not change".
