## Stoddard's Focus on Coronavirus Prevention

Stoddard's facilities are following the guidance of health and safety regulations that are being implemented due to the Coronavirus (COVID-19). The standards and guidelines that have been outlined and instructed by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) are currently in effect at all of our facilities to ensure the health and wellness of our residents. CMS is responsible for ensuring the health and safety of nursing home residents by enforcing the standards required to help each resident attain or maintain their highest level of well-being. In light of the recent spread of COVID-19, CMS is providing additional guidance to nursing homes to help control and prevent the spread of the virus.

We want to make residents, their families, our dedicated staff and our community aware of this present condition and reassure everyone that we are on top of the situation. Therefore, the following initiatives are being implemented at all of our facilities:

- ♦ Visitor and employee screening upon entrance (this includes taking temperature and screening questionnaire)
- ♦ Handwashing and sanitization of hands upon entrance
- ♦ Visitor restriction (including family members)
- ♦ Limiting visitors to only medical team personnel (physicians, NPs, etc.)
- ♦ Cancelling all events involving outside personnel
- ♦ Routine education for staff on new updates from CDC and CMS concerning new developments for COVID-19
- ♦ Nursing staff updates family members via phone about residents' condition, as needed
- ♦ Residents will be able to talk to family members via skype (process underway)
- ♦ Residents are being assessed for COVID-19 symptoms on a daily basis
- ♦ Assessment of emergency preparedness supplies
- ♦ Emergency preparedness equipment in place
- ♦ Emergency supply of food and water in place
- ♦ Handwashing supplies in place
- ♦ Ongoing cleaning/sanitization of facility





Their dedication and services throughout the years have been a significant contribution in the growth and vitality of Stoddard’s mission. They were greatly appreciated and will be greatly missed.


